Karen Reissmann, a community psychiatric nurse for over 25 years, has been sacked from her job for merely speaking out against cuts and privatisation of the NHS. It appears that in Labour-run totalitarian Britain union activists now face the sack for merely voicing their concerns about the effects cuts have on patients. In response 150 health workers in Manchester have walked out on indefinite strike in Karen's support.

It is vital that all workers support this strike. This is not just to ensure that Karen is fully reinstated, but also to defeat an attempt by public sector managers to create a climate of fear under which workers are afraid to speak out and fight against cuts. This is what lies at the heart of this dispute. If it is lost managers will be in a far stronger position to intimidate workers into silence ahead of further public sector cuts in the face of a deteriorating economy and mounting government debt. This cannot be allowed to happen.

Though UNISON has backed the dispute they could be doing far more, not least by mounting a campaign of support locally and nationally with the aim of spreading the dispute. However, it is up to all workers to ensure that the 150 workers now taking action are not left isolated. We should be all raising the dispute in our workplaces and union branches in order build support. A clear message has to be sent to the Manchester Mental Health Trust that the dispute has the support of workers throughout the country.
